

Uncle Tom's Cabin: Page Number Edits

Unfortunately, the same ISBN is given for two different versions of *Uncle Tom's Cabin*. *Advanced U.S. History-Based Writing Lessons* (AUH) used the brown cover 446-page version, published in 1981. A newer version with a green cover and 511 pages was published in 2003 (a Bantam Classic reissue).

Current page number references in AUH are from the older brown version. The chart below gives the corresponding page numbers for the newer green version.
